



CLEAN MARINA PLEDGE / ONE YEAR GOAL

The first step to becoming a Clean Marina is to take a pledge to protect water quality in your marina and to post a goal for pollution prevention. As a pledged Clean Marina you agree to complete the Clean Marina worksheet to apply for full certification within one year.

Pollution Prevention Goal

Write a pollution prevention goal for the year and stick to it. Be as specific as possible.

Explain how you intend to achieve your goal by writing the results you want to achieve and the steps you will take. Include timelines and who will be responsible.

State your goal and steps to achieve your goal. Be as specific as possible.

1. Complete revisions to the Oakland Bay Patron Guide which include incorporation of the BMP's and Spill Response Plan. Proactively communicate new BMPs to tenants along with other topics such as boat cleaning, gray water, sewage, spill prevention.
2. Explore providing education and/or collection for anti-freeze, bilge water and/or used marine batteries.
3. Develop guidance and a Port permit for boathouse owners wishing to renovate their boathouses. The template will address pollution prevention & fire flow issues.
4. Explore less toxic and more corrosion-proof alternatives to galvanized steel for over and in-water repairs.
5. Make a presentation on the Clean Marina Certification, actions we have taken to protect water quality, and upcoming goals at an Open House for Oakland Bay scheduled for October 2009.
6. Visibly display/ post Clean Marina certification and this goal.
